On train platform – Getting hit by a train as it arrives Falling from platform onto track Falling between train and platform Getting caught in automatic doors as it closes Being left behind on platform due to pressure of numbers on train Interacting with general public (COMD infection)	All	 Team will ensure that traveling party remains in an orderly group, standing well back from the edge of the platform until the train is stationary YP to be briefed about waiting well back from the platform line (well behind the yellow line) and allowing other train users to disembark the train before they board Team to supervise and be appropriately positioned on the platform for effective supervision of group Only Team member to be allowed to open the train doors to either board or leave the train, and young people to be briefed accordingly Team to ensure that boarding and disembarking the train is carefully supervised by a team member in an orderly manner Warn all Team and YP about the risk of the train and the gap from the platform edge Team to be the first and last to enter when boarding, and first and last to leave when disembarking Team members to prepare contingency plan if the train is overcrowded and some of the group can not board the train due to pressure of numbers All to travel in same carriage where possible, but separated into groups with team members to travel in different carriages if required (seating space and social distancing) All to wear face covering as required in line with government guidelines Croups to separate from other groups or individuals of the general public Team member to remain with group of assigned YP if they become separated from main group 	Medium
